For the Go-Green Project, the new colony of the Sugar Corporation of Uganda Limited was selected as the trial site for tree planting along with kitchen gardens for every home.

Ms. Juhi shares excerpts from the journey, "Last year in August 2021, when I visited the new colony, I saw only 4-5 neglected trees at a few places. Uganda is blessed with fertile soil, a lot is possible on this land. Hence, I shared this thought with Mrs. Khatau, who then took up the whole matter and with the help of our Chief Executive Mr. A.K. Shah the entire Go-Green Project came to life.

Mr Anil Shah's idea to allot kitchen gardens, brought great joy to every household. Closely aided by Mr Karunakaran, together they masterfully organized tools, mechanisms and systems, to ensure smooth execution of the entire cleanliness process in the SCOUL factories and residential areas.

A host of fruit trees, flowering plants and vegetables were planted with the help of the residents of the colony. What makes this more special is that organic manure like bio-compost from the Sugar Factory is being used to aid the plant's growth. The tree planting initiative was later expanded to other areas of the campus, factory and also in Kayunga Estate at Lugazi, Uganda. Future plans include expanding the project to areas outside the campus as well.




DRIVE AGAINST SINGLE-USE PLASTICS

To educate the public about the hazards of using plastics, Mrs. Khatau initiated a Wall Painting Drive on the SCOUL campus. These paintings with a theme to avoid plastics, save the environment, save Mother Earth, etc. were painted on the compound walls of the campus. The paintings serve as a reminder to the team at SCOUL to avoid the use of plastics.




As a part of this exercise, the use of plastics inside the SCOUL campus is banned and instead cloth bags usage is encouraged.

Plastic Garbage is segregated and handed over to the collecting agency for recycling purposes.











WASTE COLLECTION, SEGREGATION, AND DISPOSAL

The housemaids and the home keepers are being trained on how to segregate the wastes, by the Welfare team members. On a daily basis, the Welfare team in coordination with HR and the housekeeping team has been collecting wastes from factories, offices and from the employee's residence and colony.

The segregation is being done hereafter into bio-compostable wastes and non bio-compostable wastes (mainly plastic wastes). The bio-compostable wastes are used for vermiculture which shall be used in the kitchen garden. The non bio-compostable are collected and handed over to agencies who collect them for making recycled plastics.

"As a part of this exercise, we have given the housemaids and the home keepers of employees' two waste-collecting baskets. One painted in red is to be used for non bio-compostable wastes and the other painted in green for other wastes," says Ms. Nansubuga Phiona Welfare Supervisor.

Sharing her views on the Go Green Project, Mrs. Khatau said, "The aim is to make SCOUL a model eco-friendly campus and the best place to live for our employees."

Besides the customary hoisting of the National Flag, a tribute was also paid to the martyrs who sacrificed their lives over the years protecting India's security and integrity.







FELICITATING SHRI RAJENDRA HASMUKHLAL DHRUVA ON HIS RETIREMENT





A drink that makes your summer times cool and refreshing. A super easy-to-make, Thandai recipe is the perfect drink for festive occasions. This thick and luscious drink is packed with dry nuts and flavored with fragrant spices.

INGREDIENTS

Keep aside..

½ teaspoon Saffron strands

¼ cup Warm milk

THANDAI INGREDIENTS

2 cups Half and Half (use regular milk)

1¾ cup Whole milk

¾ tablespoon Rose water

1/4 cup Sugar + 2 tablespoons (adjust according to taste)

½ cup Water (optional)

THANDAI MASALA INGREDIENTS-YIELDS ¾ CUPS OF THANDAI MIX

12 Almonds

12 Cashews

10 Pistachios

3/4 teaspoon Black Peppercorns (adjust according to taste)

10 Cardamom Powder (or use 1½ teaspoons of Cardamom Powder)

1 teaspoon Poppy Seeds

1 teaspoon Fennel seeds (or use 1½ teaspoons of fennel seeds powder)

1 tablespoon Melon Seeds (chaarmagaz)

½ teaspoon Cinnamon powder

½ teaspoon Nutmeg Powder

1¼ teaspoons Rose petal spread (gulkhand)

METHOD

- 1. Soak saffron in warm milk for 10 minutes. Mix and set 9. Strain the mixture through a sieve.
- 2. Meanwhile, combine milk + half-n-half in a large pot.
- 3. Add sugar.
- 4. Whisk until well blended.
- 5. Stir in Thandai Powder.
- 6. Mix it well.
- 7. Stir in rose petal jam or gulkhand
- 8. Bring the milk mixture to a boil. Keep stirring the 14. Give it a good stir. thandai. Once the thandai comes to a full boil, take it off 15. Pour in glasses. the flame. Allow the Thandai to sit for a while (an hour or 16. Garnish with slivered almonds, saffron strands and more) so that it can soak in all the flavors. Stir in rose serve chilled. water and mix until well blended.

- 10. Press the leftover gritty stuff with a spoon and allow the thandai to drain through the sieve.
- 11. Pour in saffron milk that we had prepared earlier in the recipe. Mix until well blended.
- 12. Cover the Thandai mix with a plastic cover. Refrigerate for 3-4 hours or overnight.
- 13. Chilled thandai is ready to be served.

COOKING TIPS TO MAKE THE BEST SARDAI OR THANDAI RECIPE

- Soaking saffron strands in hot milk releases its color and flavor.
- Pour in rose water, after the Thandai is cooled. You can go easy on the rose water, taste and then add more.
- No rose spread/gulkand (sweet preserve of rose petals) on hand, no worries. Flavor thandai recipe with double the quantity of rose water. Also, add dried rose petal leaves to Thandai. This will elevate its taste and boost its flavor.
- For an extra boost of flavor, you can dry roast all the nuts and seeds to enhance the flavor.
- Water is optional. But if you find thandai too thick to drink, add a little water to adjust the consistency to your liking
- Thandai tastes best when served chilled. Therefore, chill it for a few hours or overnight before you plan to serve it.
